



Y5/6 CPR and Bleed Control Training

The West Midlands Air Ambulance Service recently ran important CPR and bleed control training for our year 5/6 children. The sessions were extremely well received and taught the children valuable life saving skills.



School Absence

Although we aim for every child to attend school for 100% of the time, we do recognise that children may be absent from time to time for unforeseen circumstances or illness.

School Day

A reminder that the school day starts at 8:45am. It is important that your children are in school ready to start the school day by this time so that staff can register the children, order lunches and start lessons as quickly as possible.

Gates and doors start to be shut and locked just after this time so if your child arrives after 8.50am then they should enter school through the front office.

September Attendance

School attendance for September was: 95.59%

Classes with the highest attendance were: Ospreys (97.56%), Hawks (97.47%), Eagles (97.18%)

Classes with the lowest attendance were: Kestrels (92.04%), Harriers (93.48%), Falcons (94.44%)

It all adds up!

Attending school everyday gives your child the best chance of success.	100%
Attending 4.5 days every week = 4 weeks missed learning per year	90%
Attending 4 days a week = 8 weeks missed learning per year.	80%
Attending 3.5 days a week = 12 weeks missed learning per year.	70%

80% attendance adds up to missing 2 full years of education over their school life!

Can they afford to keep missing out?









Nasal Flu Vaccinations

Flu vaccinations take place in school on the 16th and 17th October. All parents should return their child's consent form to the school office as soon as possible, even if you do not want your child to have the flu vaccination this year.

reasons to vaccinate your child against flu



 Protect your child. The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia



 Protect you, your friends and family. Vaccinating your child will help protect more vulnerable friends and family



No injection needed. The nasal spray is painless and easy to have

Avoid costs. If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare

What should I do?

Children aged two and three years old are offered this vaccination in general practice. Your child's GP surgery should contact you. If you haven't heard from their GP by early November, contact them directly to make an appointment.

Children in reception class and school years 1, 2, 3 & 4 will be offered the vaccine at school. Your child's school will provide details from the local healthcare team.







Pupil Premium and School Funding

Did you know that if your child is registered for benefits led Free School Meals they are eligible for the following:

- A free school meal everyday in school until they leave primary school.
- Free entry to breakfast club (bookable through ParentMail)
- A £15 supermarket voucher for every eligible child for each week of the school holidays (provided by Gloucestershire County Council through the holiday voucher scheme).
- Free holiday activities (provided through Gloucestershire's HAF/HAP scheme).
- Subsidised after school clubs.

The school also receives extra funding for every child who is eligible for benefits led Free School Meals (also known as the pupil premium) which allows us to provide extra support to our pupils.
